

Resolution to Prohibit Fluoride in Georgia Public Water Systems

Submitted to the Georgia State GOP Convention by Congressional District 11

WHEREAS, the Georgia Republican Party affirms individual liberty, limited government, and the right to clean, unmedicated drinking water; and

WHEREAS, the principle of informed consent—central to medical ethics and Georgia law—requires that no substance with systemic effects be administered without individual choice; and

WHEREAS, fluoride is widely available in toothpaste, rinses, and supplements, removing any medical justification for involuntary mass exposure; and

WHEREAS, the 2024 National Toxicology Program found fluoride levels above 1.5 mg/L are associated with reduced IQ in children, raising public health and liability concerns; and

WHEREAS, adding fluoride to public water constitutes mass medication without dosage control or informed consent, infringing upon bodily autonomy and parental rights; and

WHEREAS, no other drug is administered through the water supply to entire populations, regardless of individual health status or risk;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Georgia Republican Party urges the Georgia General Assembly to prohibit the addition of fluoride to all public water systems in the state;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, the Commissioner of Public Health, and the Georgia Republican Caucus for prompt consideration and action.
